

## Sayuja Mukti – per Madhvacarya’s teachings

ādatte hari-hastena  
hari-dṛṣṭayaiva paśyati  
gachec ca hari-pādābhyām  
muktasyaiṣā sthitir bhavet

(Brahma Sutra bhasya of Sri Madhvacarya)

Translation

ādatte hari-hastena

- He accepts by Hari's hands.

hari-dṛṣṭayaiva paśyati

- He sees by Hari's eyes

gachec ca hari-pādābhyām

- He walks using the two feet of Hari

muktasyaiṣā sthitir bhavet

- Such is the destination of the sayujya mukta Jiva.

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The celebrated Madhva scholar named Sri Vadiraja Tirtha wrote in his Kannada Book "Vaikuntha Varnane" that sayujya mukti means that the Jiva enters into the body of Maha Visnu and experiences whatever the Supreme Lord sees, hears, eats etc. However, there is no service that the jiva renders & hence not the ultimate stage of liberation.
